They walk, they drive and some take advantage of the 46 bus to come from Oxford, Wheatley or Great Milton and it is not surprising since the welcome from

The food is equally amazing and there is a wide variety to choose from. Dishes range from Gurkha Palace specials (I particularly like the Trishuli King Prawns and the Gorkhali Lamb) but there are Tandoori dishes, Chow Mein, Vegetarian, Biryani and classic Indian dishes too. Everything is freshly cooked and well presented and served with a smile. The service is very personal with attention paid to their customer's needs. The attractive restaurant is at the back of The Chequers so a wide range of drinks is available.

The restaurant is open Tuesday to Sunday 5.30pm to 10.30pm; A Sunday Buffet is served from 6.00pm to 10.00pm and lunches are available on Friday, Saturday and Sunday when fish and chips and burgers are added to the range of food available. A take-away service is also offered with free delivery within a three-mile radius with a minimum order of £20. Special offers are available with 15% discounts on collection of a take away meal and 10% discounts for NHS staff, students and BMW staff.

Prem and Kabita also offer outside catering for parties and special occasions and they are very happy to welcome large parties. Horspath Senior Residents will be dining there in October with about 25 people enjoying a set meal.

#### **Home Library Service**

Would you like to borrow library books but are unable to visit the library for any reason? If you're finding it difficult to get to a library, the Home Library Service may be able to help.

The Home Library Service is run by Oxfordshire County Council and serves 900 customers across the county.

With the help of volunteers, it looks after and delivers books and audio-visual items to those who struggle to physically visit a library due to their personal circumstances. The service is completely free of charge to customers, many of whom are elderly or housebound, and it can also be used on a short-term basis following illness or hospitalisation. Those with carer responsibilities are also welcome to apply.

#### How it works

Contact us to discuss the kind of Books, Large Print/Regular Print, DVDs, Audio Books on CD, Music CD or DVD's, that you like to read or enjoy. We can then arrange for a library volunteer to deliver these to you in your home. Our volunteers are DBS checked, wear an identification badge and provide a helpful and friendly service. Whenever possible, we try to arrange for the same volunteer to visit you each time. Your library materials will be delivered and collected every 3 weeks. The Home Library Service is free of charge, and there is no charge for requests or late returns.




Down to the sea they went every day, to the beach hut they'd hired for all of their stay. Mojo thought it was a great idea he could stay there with mum while dad had a beer.

#### **Horspath Parish Council**

Welcome to two new Parish Councillors, Mrs Hilary Franklin and Mr George Walker who were both co-opted onto the Parish Council at the July meeting. A grant application has been submitted to South Oxfordshire District Council's Community Infrastructure Levy Grant Scheme for a new play area. The new play area will replace the existing play area by the village hall. More information to follow. The footpath at Manor Drive has now been tarmacked and the cost will be covered using Community Infrastructure Levy funds received by the Parish Council. A meeting has taken place recently with a representative from Oxfordshire County Council Highways department to discuss 20mph speed limits in the village. More information to follow. Councillors and residents attended a consultation held by Sustrans, who are looking to change the way that cyclists pass through the village and reduce traffic. Several comments about the proposals were put forward and will be considered by Sustrans. A meeting has taken place with South Oxfordshire District Council's Tree Officer to inspect the Horse Chestnut tree on the Village Green by the war memorial that has been damaged. The Tree Officer has stated that the tree needs to be felled and a replacement tree to be planted. There is also a cherry tree that has died which needs to be felled. The damage to the Horse Chestnut tree has been reported to the Police but as there is no evidence, no further action will be taken. We are looking for a Handyman/lady to carry out general maintenance in the village on an 'as and when' required basis. # SCARECROW TRAIL RETURNS FOR 2024



#### Horspath Cricket Club flying high at top



Despite this wet English summer, Horspath Cricket Club have been shining brightly in matches. The 1st XI won their first eight games in Cherwell League Division 1 to establish a commanding lead, while at the same time having another terrific run in the Voneus Village Cup. The side were crowned Oxfordshire champions for the third time in four years with a

nail-biting four-wicket win at Oxford Downs in the county final. That saw Horspath progress to the national rounds where they defeated Berkshire winners Peppard Stoke Row by 31 runs in front of a crowd of around 250. Horspath had home advantage with a competitive 179 against Grampound Road (Devon & Cornwall) in the last 16 only for the match to be washed out by a huge deluge during the tea interval. Making a near 500-mile round trip to Cornwall for the second successive year to replay the fixture, Horspath's dreams of going all the way to Lord's were dashed with a five-wicket defeat. The side have also been impressive in T20 competitions, reaching the Hartwell Senior Cup semi-finals and the Cherwell League's Pullinger Cup finals day. Horspath's women, finished

third in their group in the League Counties Home Development Super 8 competition, before debuting in the Home Counties Women's League where they have been very much on a learning curve. Litt Trophy in his name up to the early 2000s and this year a memorial E.P. Litt event with a junior event featuring some of our most experienced U18 riders from across England and Wales. Horspath kicked off the day, finishing 2nd out of five teams in the first meeting, securing a place in the semi-final where we finished joint second with Ipswich. In the semi-final, we finished joint second with Ipswich, which was enough to reach the final when the young team, spearheaded by Zac Payne, a split club rider between Kesgrave and Horspath, won overall. Great Blakenham took 2nd place, Southampton 3rd, and Horspath finished 4th.



Robyn joined the club in 1986 and sadly passed away in August 2022 from cancer. He was our most successful team manager, winning two British Team Championships, six indoor titles, six premier league titles, three Gold Cups, and several regional leagues. Robyn was also our treasurer, securing deals that helped the club survive over the years.
